In today's Vatnik Soup, I'll introduce an Estonian lawyer, social activist, politician, and useful idiot for the Kremlin, Varro Vooglaid (@varrovooglaid). He's best-known for promoting pro-Kremlin viewpoints under the guise of "traditional family values."

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Vooglaid has an academic background, which usually gives people plenty of credibility in the eyes of the Kremlin. Most of his academic career was spent at the University of Tartu, but he was also a researcher between 2007 and 2011 at the University of Helsinki.

Varro is likely the most influential vatnik in Estonia. His academic credentials provide him credibility, while his religious image appeals to "traditionalists" - many of whom oddly admire Russia and its imperialistic nature.


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In 2011, Varro established the Foundation for the Protection of Family and Tradition (SAPTK), with an ideology allegedly "based on Christian teaching," basically opposing Estonian progressive legislation ("Kooseluseadus") which allowed same sex marriage.



As the chairman of the board of SAPTK, Vooglaid is no stranger to pushing narratives that align with Kremlin interests. His main channel for propaganda is Objektiiv - a media outlet run by SAPTK. Basically, it's like any other "independent" fake news blog out there.



Objektiiv pushes anti-NATO, anti-EU, and pro-"traditional values" messaging fully aligned with Moscow's interests. For example, there's plenty of attacks against Klaus Schwab from the World Economic Forum, and von der Leyen from the EU Commission.




In 2023, Vooglaid was elected as an independent candidate to the Riigikogu on EKRE's list. He's been publicly advocating for Estonia to "improve" ties with Russia. His main go-to line is "we must not irritate Russia, or else it will attack."

Prime Minister Kaja Kallas said on Thursday in the program "First Studio" that "Ukraine is at war with our enemy, IN THE DIRECT SENSE OF THE WORD". Insofar as he said this as the head of the government of the Republic of Estonia (in which capacity he participated in the program), he obviously meant the Republic of Estonia by "we".

Such statements carry a great deal of weight and potentially far-reaching consequences. Therefore, they should not be treated indifferently or lightly. On the contrary, they must be taken seriously.

In my opinion, it is absolutely unacceptable that the head of the government of the Republic of Estonia consistently makes statements according to which the Republic of Estonia is at war - as if the Republic of Estonia and Ukraine are not two different countries. Such declarations are of great importance politically and also in terms of international law, because in a sense they are acts of national self-determination.

Previously, Kallas has directly said that Estonia is at war (see, for example, here https://bit.ly/3UOVKU9). But the statement made in the "First Studio" also points to this very conclusion, because according to my best understanding, the political leaders of the Republic of Estonia can only name the countries with which the Republic of Estonia is actually at war as enemies (especially if it is said that the enemies are not figuratively or figuratively, but literally).

THE MAIN QUESTION here is what goal is actually being guided in the foreign and defense policy of the Republic of Estonia - is it the goal that the war does not reach Estonia, or the opposite goal, that the war comes to Estonia? This is not a rhetorical question, because more and more it seems as if a certain group is working for the expansion of the war and for it to reach Estonia (see https://bit.ly/3UQbmXL).


If our goal is that the war in Ukraine does not expand and does not reach Estonia, then the leading politicians of our country must consistently emphasize that the Republic of Estonia is not at war, does not treat any country as being at war with itself, and does not agree with the interpretation by anyone else of any step taken by the Republic of Estonia (e.g. giving arms to Ukraine) as being at war or going to war.

In Varro's delusional world, the 2014 Euromaidan protests were part of the "color revolution" series "organized by the CIA." He also promoted a bizarre, unsourced story claiming that Turkey and former Ukrainian president Poroshenko attempted to take Crimea "with Jihad."





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Vooglaid's SAPTK is loosely connected to Russian "conservative" organizations like Konstantin Malofeev's and Vladimir Yakunin's Congress of World Familes. No financial ties between the two have been confirmed, but this wouldn't be the first club these oligarchs support.



Fundamentalist organisations are developing their networks and branches all over the world. Among them are CitizenGo, El Yunque, Tradition, Family, Property (TFP), World Congress of Families, and Agenda Europe. They are very active in Europe. In 2013, Russian President Putin joined the game and after forming an alliance with the church, he became the "Lion of Christianity". Can you briefly map these movements and their role in this struggle for power over half the world?

The first thing we need to keep in mind is that entities promoting conservative values have been largely infiltrated by the Kremlin since around 2012. Its traces are everywhere, whether in the Polish Ordo Iuris or the French La Manif Pour Tous. At first they organised spontaneous protests against same-sex marriage, and soon after they started to be taken over by people connected to the Kremlin, such as the head of the World Congress of Families (WCF), Brian Brown.

Vooglaid also has an unhealthy, borderline romantic fascination with Putin. For example in 2017, he shared to his followers a message claiming that "President Putin presented orders of parental honor to large families."



During the celebration of the 1030th anniversary of the baptism of Kievan Rus in Moscow on Saturday, Russian President Vladimir Putin called baptism the starting point of Russian statehood and the definition of identity. Every country and nation must define its absolutes as a central part of its self-perception and set its goals in the form of ideals. The Russian state and people do it this way, while the Estonian state and people align themselves with the so-called European values, i.e. the left-liberal ideological program that went bankrupt long ago. Like it or not, Russians base their self-definition on a much more permanent and solid foundation. Let the nomenclature call the people who state this fact Putin's useful idiots or agents of influence - it doesn't matter, because reality doesn't change in the slightest and history judges peoples and countries completely independently of it.

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It is worth considering the fact that our political leadership has NEVER (as far as I know) promoted childbearing as a social ideal, let alone done so to the extent that childbearing is awarded a national medal. It is not possible to buy child wealth by increasing social assistance - no amount of aid compensates for the fact that the ideal of child wealth is not respectable and when families with many children are viewed as anti-social in society. Naturally, he denied the invasion would happen in 2022.



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

During COVID mandates, Varro admired the Russian policy over Estonian, and suggested that if Russia's policy was better and more freedom loving and with less restrictions he would rather live under Russian rule. Yet, he's still trying to backpedal from this statement.



"I have said it before, and I am not ashamed to say it again, that if Russia acted in such a way as to guarantee people real constitutional rights, did not force vaccines, did not implement apartheid, gave people the opportunity to live and raise their children according to their beliefs, did not start threatening you with imprisonment, did not want to disarm you, did not want to limit your parental rights, did not want to inject your children behind your back then a very serious question would arise very quickly: "I don't know, at the end of the day I want to live a normal life. Call it the Republic of Estonia or the Governorate of Estonia or something else. Whoever guarantees people the opportunity to live normally here, people will stick to it. You can't endlessly (claim) with some kind of emotional argument that we must have blue and white in this tower, what if under this blue and white you **are harassing and bullying and suppressing people**."

For Varro, the reason for Russian invasion (he previously denied would even happen) was clear - it was of course that pesky NATO for daring to accept countries begging to join, afraid Russia would invade them again! And as always, there's zero blame on Russia.



Of course, this is also a gloomy statement from the point of view of Estonian defense policy. Especially in the knowledge that Russia has now clearly proven that its long-expressed talk about the inadmissibility of NATO expansion under Russia's borders has not been spoken in vain; as well as in the knowledge that Estonia has a dime compared to Ukraine on the geopolitical table.

Nothing good is on the horizon in all of this. However, there are a lot of gloomy clouds.



Vooglaid is ready to throw Estonia under the bus in order to get some good boy points from the Kremlin. For example, after the Ukrainian drone assault against Pskov airbase, Russian propaganda claimed the drones came from Estonia. Varro didn't rule this out.

Tonight's drone attack on the Pskov airbase makes us wonder how easily the war in Ukraine can spill over to our border. If the drones or missiles used in the attack had been launched from Estonian territory, which, according to Kaja Kallas, should also be at war with Russia, then all hell would probably break loose pretty quickly. I do not dare to rule out that if the corresponding order was given to our deputy administrators, it would be carried out - accompanied by stories that all this is being done to support Ukraine and in the interest of Estonian security. The fact that a certain group would be happy to see the expansion of the front from Ukraine to the Baltic states cannot be considered beyond doubt either.

Varro doesn't hide his admiration for other dictators either. He's praised Assad, denied the Syrian chemical attacks, and even edited an interview with Assad himself. He's also quoted biased Russian outlets like the New East Outlook.



The Big Interview: According to Bashar al-Assad, the war in Syria is a microcosm of World War III



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

He's backed legislation like Russia's "foreign agents" law. Varro questioned criticism of such laws, hinting they "could be beneficial." I think we all already know who benefits from them, and why they were so aggressively pushed by the Kremlin in Russia & Georgia.



Back in 2018, Varro strongly opposed the sanctions imposed against Russia after the Skripal poisonings. He said the sanctions were set "without ensuring whether the accusations under which sanctions are being applied are true."
