



# The Ron Paul Institute for Putin's Priorities

Former congressman's think tank pushes pro-Kremlin line





Numerous members of the Ron Paul Institute for Peace and Prosperity have spent years as professional spin-doctors for Russian President Vladimir Putin and other leaders of oppressive regimes, according to an analysis by the *Washington Free Beacon*.

The institute's namesake, former congressman and failed presidential candidate Ron Paul, recently made headlines when he defended Putin's invasion of Ukraine. "Actually he has some law on his side," Paul said on Fox Business Channel's "The Independents" last week.


He's also promoted Scott Horton's historically inaccurate pro-Kremlin propaganda book, "Provoked: How Washington Started the New Cold War with Russia and the Catastrophe in Ukraine." In the book, Horton shifts all the blame for Russia's genocidal invasion on Obama & Biden.

This leads us to the second point: NATO did not *expand* into "Eastern Europe." Czechia, Poland, and Hungary in 1999 and the Baltic countries among others in 2004 actively sought membership in the alliance. This is not just semantics. For the historical reasons mentioned above, the West has been a desired political direction associated with prosperity, democracy, and freedom—despite the limitations of Western liberal capitalist democracies and the implementation of that model in Eastern Europe. Being at the receiving end of Russian imperialism, many Eastern Europeans looked forward to membership in NATO as a means of securing their sovereignty. NATO, in other words, would not have "expanded" into Eastern Europe if the Eastern European nations had not wanted it and actively pursued it.

To this day, Russia has not invaded a NATO country, and neither has any NATO country invaded Russia. And by the way, Russian media has already moved on to 100% Russkiy Mir imperialism, and don't even mention NATO anymore.


