In today's Vatnik Soup, I'll introduce an American national security policy professional and the current under secretary of defense for policy, Elbridge Colby (@ElbridgeColby). He's best-known for fighting with cartoon dogs online and for halting military aid to Ukraine.

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Elbridge "Cheese" Colby earned his bachelor's degree from Yale and a Juris Doctor from Harvard Law School. Before entering government, he worked at top think tanks and in the intelligence community, focusing on nuclear policy and strategic planning.

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Prior to this, Colby was from 2014 to 2017 the Robert M. Gates Senior Fellow at the Center for a New American Security. From 2010 to 2013 he was principal analyst and division lead for global strategic affairs at CNA. Earlier in his career he served for over five years in the U.S. Government working on a range of strategic forces, arms control, WMD, and intelligence reform matters, including service with the Coalition Provisional Authority in Iraq in 2003 and with the Office of the Director of National Intelligence during its stand-up in 2005-2006. Colby has also served on the staff of a number of government commissions, including the 2014 National Defense Panel, the 2008-2009 Strategic Posture Commission, and the 2004-2005 President's WMD Commission.

Cheese quickly became a key voice for a "China First" strategy, arguing the US must prioritize military buildup in Asia over commitments in Europe or the Middle East. He sees (or saw, rather) Taiwan as the core test of US credibility.

### Elbridge Colby: "I am signalling to China that my policy is status quo"

The American strategist, tipped to be Trump's national security adviser, on the balance of power in Asia.

F or about a decade, Elbridge Colby has been making a single argument in and out of government: that America can't afford Chinese hegemony in Asia. He has also been saying that this outcome is narrowly preventable, provided Washington renews its industrial base and stewards its existing military capabilities – rather than waste them on Europe and the Middle East.

Colby served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Strategy in Trump's first term. He was the lead architect of the 2018 National Defense Strategy, which shifted US military focus from terrorism to "great power competition" with China and Russia.



Still in 2018, Colby saw Russia very much as a threat. The NDS report called Russia a revisionist power that seeks to "shatter NATO" and control its neighbors. He framed both China and Russia as top threats to the global order.

### National Defense Strategy released with clear priority: Stay ahead of Russia and China

WASHINGTON — The Pentagon's new National Defense Strategy lays out a world where great-power competition, rather than counterterrorism, will drive the department's decision-making and force structure.

The 2018 NDS also emphasized "deterrence by denial", meaning the U.S. must convince adversaries like Russia that they can't achieve their goals through force. According to Colby at that time, NATO and US alliances were central to this strategy.

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Fortify the Trans-Atlantic NATO Alliance. A strong and free Europe, bound by shared principles of democracy, national sovereignty, and commitment to Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty is vital to our security. The alliance will deter Russian adventurism, defeat terrorists who seek to murder innocents, and address the arc of instability building on NATO's periphery. At the same time, NATO must adapt to remain relevant and fit for our time—in purpose, capability, and responsive decision-making. We expect European allies to fulfill their commitments to increase defense and modernization spending to bolster the alliance in the face of our shared security concerns.

Fast forward to 2025: Elbridge, now Trump's under secretary of defense for policy, directed a halt in key US weapons shipments to Ukraine, including Patriots, HIMARS rounds, and F-16 missiles, as Russia intensified attacks on Ukrainian civilians.

Maybe the biggest problem with Cheese's worldview is that he's treating China, Russia, and North Korea as isolated threats, completely ignoring the fact that these countries are coordinating and collaborating together.

Hell, Russia even brought Laos into the equation.



What an irony. Following tonight's massive Russian air attack on Ukraine, we discovered in Kyiv a component of a Russian-Iranian "Shahed-136"/"Geran-2" combat drone, which was made in China and supplied just recently.

And right on the eve, the Chinese Consulate General's building in Odesa suffered minor damage as a result of Russian strikes on the city.

There is no better metaphor for how Putin continues to escalate his war and terror while involving others, including North Korean troops, Iranian weapons, and some Chinese manufacturers.

Security in Europe, the Middle East, and the Indo-Pacific is inextricably linked. This is not an attention competition. Countering Russian aggression and terror in Europe directly contributes to enhancing security in the Middle East and the Indo-Pacific.

We urge the United States and the international community to increase pressure on both the regime in Moscow and its war budget, as well as everyone else around the world who supports Russia's war effort and enables Putin to continue killing people in Ukraine. There is no more time to wait.

Even though Colby's referred to himself as a "realist," his policy is actually just isolationism. He ignores the fact that China is supplying Russia with equipment and dual-use technology to wage war against Ukraine, and that the two are actually close allies.



The authoritarian bloc is already here: China keeps Russia afloat economically, Iran arms it, and North Korea reinforces it. They're coordinating across continents, while Colby argues the US should only worry about Asia.



Russia's victory in Ukraine is in alignment with China's strategic goals. As a matter of fact, this was confirmed by Chinese Foreign Minister Wang, who stated that China "can't accept Russia losing its war against Ukraine." But for Cheese, Ukraine is a "distraction".

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For someone holding one of the highest positions in U.S. defense policy, Colby sure has a lot of time to argue with NAFO fellas on X. He's claimed his feed was "inundated" and that their "aggressive, ad hominem" tactics made X unusable.

**IN MAY 2022,** just months after <u>Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine</u>, a disparate group of people from across the globe decided that they wanted to fight back.

This turned into the <u>North Atlantic Fella Organization (NAFO</u>), a decentralized online activist network designed to <u>combat pro-Kremlin propaganda</u>, primarily focusing on the platform then known as Twitter. The members, identified by <u>cartoon Shiba Inu</u> <u>avatars</u>, mocked Russian government accounts and used meme warfare to disrupt Moscow's propaganda over the invasion.

But in November 2022, <u>Elon Musk took control of the platform</u>, changed its name to X, and effectively <u>allowed Russia's propagandists</u> free rein to do whatever they wanted.

While NAFO members continued to push back, posting memes in response to any posts from official Russian accounts, they knew they had to do something else to alter the course of the war. And so, over the course of the past two years, they have helped to raise tens of millions of dollars for Ukrainian frontline forces, funding weapons, ammunition, medical equipment, and vehicles—many of them branded with the distinctive NAFO livery.





He's also claimed that "NAFO isn't helping NATO or Ukraine," even though Ukraine's former Defense Minister Oleksii Reznikov personally thanked them. NAFO has received awards and support from multiple NATO countries backing Ukraine.





Like many before him (including David Sacks), Colby has hinted that NAFO might be backed by "some forms of USG and/or allied support." In Cheese's world, ordinary people can't support a cause without being paid, which makes sense coming from someone deep in MAGA politics.







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Adam, I think it's worth getting your facts straight:

 I raised the possibility of U.S. or allied government sponsorship of NAFO. I didn't specify it needed to be CIA. Several government and NATO leaders have endorsed NAFO, so it's hardly far-fetched. In any case, my core point is NAFO doesn't help NATO or Ukraine. That has only been validated in my view.

Today, alongside the Heritage Foundation, Colby is one of the most vocal critics of NATO within the Trump admin. Together, they're shaping the US foreign policy shift away from transatlantic alliances, and toward isolationist Asia-first doctrine.



In 2018, Colby warned about Russia and championed NATO. Post–Trump term one? Total pivot: Russia downplayed, NATO sidelined, and all eyes on Taiwan. Hard to tell if it's strategy, or just auditioning for MAGA foreign policy chief.



With Colby, Trumpism changed everything. NATO became the enemy, Ukraine a distraction, and China the only threat that mattered. He went from realist strategist to MAGA-friendly mouthpiece for isolation in everything but China. At the same time, China is watching Ukraine...



...closely to decide when to invade Taiwan. The most absurd twist? Cheese, the guy who built his brand around defending Taiwan, is now backing away from that too. He says a war over Taiwan might "destroy" the US military, and that it's not even an "existential interest."

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"Taiwan is very important to the United States, but as you said it's not an existential interest."

Colby also said that the military balance in the Taiwan Strait had deteriorated dramatically and raised the concern of the U.S. engaging in a futile and overly costly effort that would destroy its military.

He again criticized Taiwanese defense spending and said it wasn't fair that American servicemen and women should suffer if American allies were not pulling their weight.

This has raised fears, again, that Colby wants to abandon Taiwan. But there is a lot more going on here.



But gutting alliances, threatening your friends, and sidelining partners doesn't make America stronger. It isolates the US, and ensures the country will be alone in the next global crisis, facing adversaries who are more coordinated than ever.
